



<b>CME COURSE TITLE</b>	<b>How to develop a programme against stigma and discrimination because of schizophrenia</b>

<b>COURSE LEVEL</b>	Basic
<b>EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES</b>	At the close of this course, participants will understand and be able to : 1) take the steps involved in setting up an anti-stigma program, 2) how to anticipate and resolve some of the most common difficulties; snf 3) monitor the progress of the program and its outcome.
<b>COURSE DESCRIPTION</b>	The description of the work in these real life settings will be used to illustrate various ways of starting programmes, overcoming obstacles, building teams and evaluating the results of the work done.
<b>COURSE METHODS AND MATERIAL</b>	After the case presentations, course participants will work through the steps required to set up programs designed to reduce stigma and discrimination resulting from stigma. Course materials will be drawn from the World Psychiatric Association's Global Program to Fight Stigma and Discrimination Becuase of Schizophrenia. The format of the course will be highly interactive with a heavy emphasis on audience participation designed to identify, then resolve the many practical aspects of program start-up, implementation, and operation. Faculty from the course will be drawn from the WPA Global Anti-Stigma Program .
